I've been in touch with the people responsible for the Redbook SG246897 IBM WebSphere Portal V4 Developers Handbook. Now that the Handbook has reached final form, they have no objection to your reproducing the handbook on a CD to be distributed directly to software developers or to colleges and universities, which are expected to make the redbook contents available on their networks.

IBM is not concerned about the fact that JA-SIG may not meet a legal definition of an "enterprise" or that electronic copies of the redbook may be accessed by people other than JA-SIG members. However, if there is any money to be made from distributing the redbook (with or without modifications), IBM wants to be the one to make that money, not someone who has simply copied the redbook.

Therefore, there a couple of things we'd like to have you do as a prerequisite to including the redbook on a CD.

The first is to go through the ITSO approval process outlined in the following excerpt from a note sent to me. By going through the process, we assure the ITSO organization will have a retrievable record of your request.

"the IBM ITSO organization that creates and makes redbooks available has an internal process by which you can obtain permission directly from them to reproduce the final version of the Handbook if you still want to do so. You can find the process at <http://ibm.com/redbooks> by selecting the "Contact Us" tab at the left side of the page."

The second thing is to include a notice that users must traverse on their way to the redbook. The notice should state that the redbook is made available with permission from International Business Machines Corporation and that the requirements of the Personal Use and Commercial Use sections of the IBM Redbooks Copyright Information found at <http://ibm.com/redbooks> are binding on anyone accessing the handbook either on the CD or through a network on which the CD contents have been loaded.

The notice should be visible whether the CD or a network copy is being accessed. Since you'll probably be using either a PDF or an HTML version of the redbook, it shouldn't be any great trick to add this notice at the front end of the redbook.

The third thing is to include a link back to the web page where the redbook appears with text that indicates that updates, if any, to the redbook can be obtained at the linked web page. The link text can be part of the notice mentioned above.

Thanks for the update. This is not an urgent request, so the next week or so if fine.

As I interpreted the two options, both personnel and commercial was limited to the individual's computers or the enterprise. I had two concerns. JA-SIG is not a legal entity. Even though it conducts business--such as running conferences--it doesn't have legal form; everything is contributed services and funds. So JA-SIG itself may not be an "enterprise." The other problem is scope. As soon as we produce this on CD-ROM, it will appear on networks of 200 to 300 colleges and universities where we cannot guarantee only JA-SIG participants (individuals) would have access.

I appreciate your willingness to work this example through. The Redbooks are exceptionally well written, high content, documents.
